

RULES OF CONDUCT

for the visitors of the National Museum of the History of Ukraine in the Second World War. Memorial Complex

While visiting the Memorial Complex on its territory and in the exposition halls the visitors have to:

- follow the generally accepted rules and norms of public order and safety conditions;
- not create obstacles in the work of the museum staff, inconveniences to other visitors and danger to their lives;
- avoid actions that cause deterioration of exhibits, damage to property and equipment;
- move towards the exit to the green light signals in case of switching off the light in the exposition halls of the main building.

It's forbidden:

- to enter the exhibitions in overcoats, with large shopping bags, packages, segways, prams, etc;
- to give the *tours* without being accompanied by an *employee* of the Museum;
- to use film, video and photo recording methods without a permission of administration;
- to use unmanned aerial vehicles (drones, quadcopters etc.) without a permission of administration;
- to ride bicycles, to roller-skate, etc;
- to go beyond barriers;
- to walk on the slopes and green areas, to walk the dogs;
- to climb the sculptural compositions and the samples of military equipment;
- to use any kind of transportation on the territory of the Memorial Complex without a permission of administration;
- to be on the territory of the Memorial: from April 1st to September 30th – from 11.00 p.m. till 6.00 a.m. and from October 1st to March 31st – from 8.00 p.m. till 7.00 a.m.
